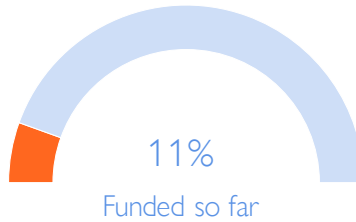

EMERGENCY RESPONSE AND RECOVERY



Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

- » 9,000 people benefitted from safer water
- » 500 people benefitted from sanitation
- » 1,365 reports produced on the needs of internally displaced and other affected persons.



Emergency Health

- » 62,839 persons reached with medical consultation through IOM support
- » 35,402 individuals referred for further medical treatment
- » 466 persons reached with vaccination for outbreak preparedness/response through IOM support



Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)

- » 76 sites receiving direct site management services.
- » 141,904 individuals in IOM managed sites
- » 63% processed feedback (CFM)



Shelter and Housing (NFIs)

- » 404 community members trained on construction skills
- » 1,654 households that receive emergency shelter support and repairs
- » 4,963 of target vulnerable people receiving shelter NFIs

PEACE AND DEVELOPMENT COORDINATION



Community Engagement and Policing

- » 1 districts administrations supported with equipment for PRM
- » 21 officials trained on community engagement/policing
- » 4 CSOs trained on Community Policing



Community Resilience and Peacebuilding





- » 38 of individuals engaged in community-driven income generation opportunities
- » 4 communities benefitting from community stabilization and peacebuilding interventions
- » 5 civil society and community-based organizations supported
- » 2 of communities engaged in social and cultural revitalization activities






Migration, Environment and Climate Change and Risk Reduction (MECR)

- » 5,003 persons with access on sustainable energy solutions (SHS, ICS other solar technologies)
- » 4,993 IDPs trained on how to build an ICSs
- » 196 Energy Savings and Lending Groups established, trained and active
